

2016 CMSA 7v7 Built Out Line Policy Per US SOCCER

The build out line is used to promote playing the ball out of the back in an unpressured setting. **Punting the ball is not allowed** as this would defeat the purpose of the build out line and reduces the opportunity to play out of the back in an unpressured setting. After the ball is put into play, the opposing team can then cross the build out line and play can resume as normal.

Development Rules for 7v7



- The build out line is used to promote playing the ball out of the back in an unpressured setting
- When the goalkeeper has the ball, either during play (from the opponent) or from a goal kick, the opposing team must move behind the build out line

Development Rules for 7v7



- Once the opposing team is behind the build out line, the goalkeeper can pass, throw or roll the ball to a teammate (no punting)
- After the ball is put into play by the goalkeeper, the opposing team can cross the build out line and play resumes as normal
